

**Updates on Programmes for**  
**July – August 2018**

**A. Radio**

No.	Date	Items
1.	14 June – 15 July	R1 co-operated with ViuTV to provide live commentary for 19 matches in “世界盃・多星道”.
2.	5 July / 9 July	R5 organized two outreaches for the “Stand By Me Parental Programme 2018-19” (有你同行升級家長計劃 2018-19：家家同行共體驗). School visits were arranged to deliver anti-drug messages among secondary school students and their families.
3.	9 July	CIBS premiered Q21 programmes with Arts and Culture as its theme.
4.	9 July – 23 August	R2 has been organizing a series of activities of Solar Project 2018 for teenagers during the summer holidays: a) Solar Project 2018 – Solar Academy (太陽學堂在乎你) on 9 July; b) Solar Project 2018 – Drug InfoCentre visit (太陽學堂藥物資訊天地參觀日) on 17 July; c) Solar Project 2018 – Youth Employment Start visit (太陽學堂青年就業起點) on 26 July; d) Solar Project 2018 – Meet the Stars (星級會客室) on 1 August; e) Solar Project 2018 – Solar Ambassadors Closing Ceremony (太陽學堂畢業禮) on 17 August; f) Solar Project 2018 – YETP Band Show (勁 Band 展翅青見夢飛行) as the project finale on 23 August.
5.	15 July – 19 August	CEU launched a 6-episode series “Master Scholars” (香港文化大師系列) in July. The programme will trace the living and footprints of Chinese master scholars or literati and their works in relation to Hong Kong.
6.	19 July / 23 August	R4 presented the live recital of pianist Rachel Cheung in “Artist-in-Residence” in July. To celebrate the centenary of Leonard Bernstein’s birth, a special programme with narration and performance will be arranged in August.
7.	20 July / 27 July	R5 organized another “Age-friendly City Seminar” at Tsuen Wan (長者友善城市專題講座- 荃灣區). Outreach will also be held in the district in late July.

8.	20 July	“CIBS Showcase” (社區參與廣播不停站) was conducted to promote the service. Representatives from CIBS Q21 programmes were invited to share experiences with the public.
9.	29 July / 12 August	CEU will organize two activities for “Children Sunday” (好孩子。暑假最好的) during the summer holidays. The first activity “STEM @ The Happiest Summer” (STEM @公大初體驗) in July will visit Hong Kong Open University to enhance children’s knowledge on Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. For the second one “STEAM @ The Happiest Summer” (STEAM @聲音新體驗) in August, a music workshop will be arranged for children to learn, play and enjoy music.
10.	29 July – 2 September	PAU will produce a special series, namely “You need to know GBA” (你要懂的大灣區), in late July during the summer break of the “City Forum” (城市論壇). The series comprises 6 episodes to introduce the development of the Greater Bay Area.
11.	5 August – 23 September	R1 will continue to produce a new round of “Talking to CEO 2018” (與 CEO 對話 2018). 8 elites from various enterprises will be interviewed.
12.	25 August	PAU will organize the “Voices from the Hall – Land Supply Consultation” (眾言堂 – 土地諮詢) in late August.
13.	End of August - October	A synergy programme by Radio and TV Divisions titled “DJ Talk Show” (廣播道開咪) will start broadcast from end-August on R2 and TV 31. The host Sandy Lamb (林珊珊) will interview some renowned and legendary broadcasters in this 8-episode series.

1.	1 July	TV Division provided technical support, coverage, pool signal and live broadcast for “The Flag Raising Ceremony to Celebrate the 21 <sup>st</sup> Establishment of the HKSAR of the People’s Republic of China” & “The Reception to Celebrate the 21 <sup>st</sup> Establishment of the HKSAR of the People’s Republic of China”.
2.	2 July	“Children Summer Special 2018”(Harry 哥哥放暑假)(45 episodes x 15 minutes) paid home visit and arranged different activities including singing and playing magic with children.
3.	6 & 7 July	“Hong Kong Inter-school Basketball Marathon 2018” will be relayed on RTHK 32.
4.	10 July	“Hidden History of FIFA World Cup”(世界盃有故講)(2 episodes x 60 minutes): the hosts travelled to Latin America and Europe to meet the real characters and witnesses of the hidden stories of the World Cup.
5.	15 July	Mobile TV Campaign (沒有牆的流動電視廳) invited disabled organizations to introduce the re-run of 6 series of “A Wall-less World”(沒有牆的世界) and also publicized programmes on “90th Anniversary of Broadcasting in Hong Kong”, including “Hong Kong Stories – Reflecting Hong Kong”(香港故事 – 聲光路上) and “DJ Talk Show” (廣播道開咪) . Radio programmes included R1’s “90 Years of Broadcasting in Hong Kong” (香港廣播 90 年), R2’s “Reunion Concert of DJ, Singer - Tribute to Uncle Ray”(DJ·歌手再重聚), R4’s “Young Music Makers” and R5’s “Lung Cheung Bravo”(龍翔藝萃) .
6.	20 July	“Exploring the Edible Planet II” (惜食地球人 2)(8 episodes x 30 minutes) featured Kannie Chung, a native Hong Kong foodie, who set out on a food adventure to Cuba, Holland, North America, Demark, Vietnam, China & Hong Kong to meet radical thinkers and producers of food.
7.	22 July	“Granny, Butch and Waffles”(嫻嫻煮飯仔)(26 episodes x 20 minutes): Granny retired to the country to live a quiet life with her two pets, but Butch and Waffles had other ideas which took them all on some amazing adventures. Luckily a healthy home-cooked meal usually got things right back to normal.
8.	23 July	“The Secret Life of Springs” (探索泉洞力)(3 episodes x 60 minutes) took us on a trip to three continents for an in-depth exploration of three spectacular sites: the largest underground river in the world in Palawan in the Philippines; the mysterious aquifer in the Etosha desert, in Namibia and the crystal sources of Florida, in the United States. Exploring each of these aquifers also made us discover the animal species whose survival depend on these systems: manatees in Crystal River, desert elephants in Etosha and swiftlets in Palawan.
9.	25 July	“HK Econ”(講錢。講呢啲)(8 episodes x 30 minutes) explored the development of Hong Kong economy.

10.	5 August	“Within and Out 2018” (也文也武)(10 episodes x 30 minutes) will talk about the activities which are good for physical and mental health.
11.	9 August	“Through the Heart of China” 《老外遊中國》 (7 episodes x 60 minutes): Presenter/photographer Ruben Terlou and director Maaik Krijgsman will travel along the most northern point (Mohe County) to the most southern point of Chinese mainland (Hainan).
12.	12 August	Live coverage of “Hong Kong Annual Badminton Championships - Final” (全港羽毛球錦標賽(決賽)) will be broadcast on RTHK TV 32.
13.	13 August	“World's Wildest Weather”(極端天氣實錄) (6 episodes x 60 minutes) will showcase some of the most extreme weather from all around the globe with first hand witness statements.
14.	18 August	“Siblings 2” (我的兄弟姐妹 II)(8 episodes x 30 minutes) is a TV reality show. Siblings have to learn to communicate and cooperate when facing huge challenges. At the same time, various tasks will be related to social services in the hope that the kids will get to know about the society in the competition and build up correct values while learning in the games.
15.	19 August	“West Kowloon Cultural District in the Making 2018”(西九進行式 2018) (1 episode x 30 minutes): Freespace is the platform for artists and audience to encounter, exchange ideas and explore the endless possibilities of performing arts without boundaries. Situated right in the centre of the Art Park is Freespace, a place where the public is invited to freely explore, encounter and be inspired by new artistic experiences through innovative programming across all genres. A black box theatre will provide a flexible performance space. Freespace is scheduled to open in 2019. The West Kowloon Cultural District will invite international acclaimed performers to conduct workshop and programme exchange.
16.	25 August	“Hong Kong Stories – Children Documentary” (香港故事 – 兒童系列) (10 episodes x 30 minutes) will focus on children, depicting what children concern about and their needs.
17.	26 August	“DJ Talkshow” (廣播道開咪)(8 episodes x 60 minutes) is the programme celebrating the 90 Years of Broadcasting in Hong Kong. Renowned DJs will share their stories with audience.
18.	26 August	“Sign Language 6” (手語隨想曲 6) (8 episodes x 30 minutes) will teach the vocabulary and grammar of sign language through drama.
