



Radio Television Hong Kong Environmental Report 2019

Introduction

Radio Television Hong Kong (RTHK) Environmental Report sets out RTHK's commitments to protect the environment.

As the sole public service broadcaster in Hong Kong, RTHK aims to inform, educate and entertain the general public and specific target audience through a balanced mix of high quality programming. RTHK is also committed to enhancing the public's environmental awareness.

Environmental Goal

Apart from adopting green housekeeping measures and fostering among staff an environmentally-friendly culture, RTHK spares no effort in promoting public awareness on environmental issues by:

- guiding the public to appreciate that environmental protection is everybody's business – RTHK produces trailers, radio announcements of public interest (Radio APIs) and programmes to nurture public awareness of environmental protection;
- encouraging community discussions on environmental issues and policies – RTHK provides a platform for government officials and experts from non-governmental organisations (NGOs) to share information and experience on environmental protection with members of the public who may also express their views on the subject; and
- providing opportunities for the government officials to explain its current policies and environmental protection initiatives through RTHK's programmes and projects.

Environmental Policy

In pursuance of its environmental commitments, RTHK will continue to:

- enhance public awareness on environmental protection and conservation of natural resources;
- comply with, and where appropriate exceed, legal regulations and voluntary standards in relevant operations;
- practise the principle of “Reduce, Reuse and Recycle” in the consumption of materials;
- foster personal responsibility among all RTHK staff to care for the environment and encourage them to render support through action; and
- seek continual improvement of its environmental performance on all fronts.

Environmental Highlights

In 2019, RTHK made the following major efforts in enhancing its environmental performance:

Programmes

Radio Programmes

- Produced radio programmes and programme segments which widely covered various green topics, such as green living, environmental protection, sustainable development, recycling and energy saving. These programmes include:
 - Radio 1: “Climate Watcher” and “Blue Planet”;
 - Radio 2: “Morning Suite”, “Knowledge Society” and “1-minuter of Radio 2”;
 - Radio 3: “123 Show” and “Morning Brew”;
 - Radio 5: “MagaSenior”, “Stand by Me”, “Colourful Journey”, “Green Track” and “Life is Love”;
 - Culture & Education Unit: “Sound of Nature”, “Children Sunday”, “Green Road” and “University Knowledge Platform”; and
 - Presentation Unit: “Traffic News” and “News about RTHK”.
- Participated in various green projects and activities organised by government departments and NGOs to convey the message of environmental protection, such

as “Tree Planting Day 2019”, “See Saw Keep Fit Special 2019”, “Healthy Hong Kong 2025” and “FarmFest 2019”.

TV Programmes

- The episode “Fixing Nature - Toxic Atmosphere” of the documentary “Science With You” introduced how scientists, engineers and architects on the five continents looked for ways to clean the atmosphere, in order to prevent air pollution and global warming from worsening.
- The host of “Wastecooking” visited 10 European counties and turned what others considered to be “garbage” into creative cuisines, so as to promote food saving and stop food wastage.
- The magazine programme “830 Travel Guide” introduced the landscape and the nature of Hong Kong, explored different ways of travel, shared hiking journeys, and promoted the idea of cherishing nature.
- The episode “Global Warming” of “Knowledge Zone 2019” studied the disaster preparedness for global warming and introduced different disaster preparedness training activities.
- “Agricultural Paradise” toured the crop fields in Hokkaido. In the programme, the primary school students, who became “little farmers”, experienced the plantation and harvest of crops, and learned about the process of food.

In-house Green Practices

Minimising Paper Consumption

- using e-mails for communication widely;
- promoting double-sided photocopying to reduce paper consumption; and
- promoting the use of the blank side of used paper and the reuse of envelopes.

Recycling

- placing recycling bins at suitable locations. In 2019, RTHK collected 14 282 kg of waste paper, 213.2 kg of plastic bottles and 122.7 kg of aluminium cans for recycling; and
- collecting used printer toner cartridges for recycling.

Green Products

- using photocopiers with double-sided photocopying and automatic energy saving functions;
- using plain paper fax machines instead of thermal paper ones;
- procuring environmentally-friendly products, such as refillable ball pens and recyclable printer toner cartridges;
- procuring appliances, such as refrigerators, air-conditioners and dehumidifiers with Grade 1 Energy Efficiency Label;
- adopting green procurement specifications promulgated by the Environmental Protection Department when procuring office equipment, such as water dispensers and microwave ovens; and
- ceasing to procure and provide disposable plastic umbrella bags, and setting up umbrella dryers instead.

Energy Saving

- promoting and encouraging staff to reduce lighting;
- adjusting the air-conditioning system to keep the room temperature at a reasonably acceptable level;
- affixing “Save Energy” stickers to air-conditioning and lighting switches;
- re-circulating a circular to remind staff to switch off lightings when they leave office and turn off electrical products not in use;

- carrying out energy audits for departmental buildings to identify Energy Management Opportunities;
- replacing existing lighting and air-conditioning systems with energy-saving models; and
- participating in the “Earth Hour” event.

Carbon Audit

- conducting carbon audit exercise for Broadcasting House (BH), Television House (TVH) and Educational Television Centre (ETC). In 2019-20, the amounts of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions for BH, TVH and ETC were 1 805.57, 2 107.45 and 301.37 tonnes of CO₂ equivalent respectively.

Indoor Environmental Quality

- achieving the “Good Class” of the Indoor Air Quality Objectives for departmental buildings.

E-communication

- uploading useful information to the intranet for internal reference (e.g. departmental telephone directory, circulars and important notices); and
- uploading general forms to the intranet instead of keeping the paper forms in stock.

Staff Canteen

- implementing the following green measures:
 - banning the use of plastic straw, and ceasing to provide disposable tableware for dine-in customers; and
 - ceasing to provide disposable plastic tableware to take-away customers. These customers may choose to purchase disposable tableware made of wood and paper, or bring their own reusable tableware.

Measures to Further Enhance Environmental Performance

RTHK will continue to meet its environmental objectives by means of:

- producing and broadcasting programmes on environmental issues in a variety of formats;
- continuing its efforts in arousing public concern over environmental issues;
- promoting a green procurement policy in support of its production efforts; and

- ensuring that the working environment for its staff remains safe and healthy.
